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Project Purpose

- Reduce traffic delays around CSX Railroad crossing
- Support the safe movement of trucks and freight
- Enhance safety and connectivity among bicyclists and pedestrians

Project Need

- Delays during peak hours in the morning and evening
 - Heavy truck traffic
 - Railroad crossings
- 372 crashes in study area
 - 5 fatalities (1 pedestrian)
 - o 3 pedestrian crashes
 - 8 bicyclist crashes
 - 10 train crashes at US 41 crossing




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1994 EA/FONSI Location and Study Area Map





- Initially approved in May 1994
- Evaluated the construction of Causeway Boulevard as a six-lane roadway
 - o From SR 60 to US 301






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Current Project Location and Study Area Map

- Predominantly industrial and commercial
 - Small residential pockets
- Hurricane evacuation route
- Strategic Intermodal System (SIS) south of Causeway Boulevard
- SIS Railway Connector south of Causeway Boulevard






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


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
US 41 Typical Section




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
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US 41 Typical Section





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US 41 Typical Section

US 41 over Delaney Creek, S. 36th Avenue, CSX Railroad Right-of-Way, and St. Paul Street (bridge)







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
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Stormwater Management

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CULTURAL RESOURCES

Archaeological & Historic Resources

Resources Identified:

- 35 historic resources were identified with 17 previously identified
- 0 historic resources are listed, eligible for listing, or appear potentially eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places
- 0 archaeological occurrences or sites were identified
- No anticipated adverse effects to any listed or eligible cultural resources





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Environmental Effects

NATURAL RESOURCES

Wetlands, Surface Waters, Protected Species and Habitat

Resources identified:

- 0.37 acres of wetland impacts and approximately 1.65 acres of surface water impacts.
- 0.19 acres of Essential Fish Habitat (EFH) impact
- No adverse effects to
 - 18 federally listed species
 - 18 state listed species
- No public conservation lands will be impacted





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PHYSICAL ENVIRONMENT

Noise, Air Quality & Potential Contamination Sites

- The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) approved Traffic Noise Model (TNM) predicted traffic noise levels are anticipated to result in impacts at 8 noise-sensitive residential receptors.
 - No feasible and reasonable solutions available to mitigate these impacts (no noise barriers)
- Adverse impacts on air quality are not expected because the project area is in attainment for all National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS)
- Existing potentially contaminated sites adjacent to project
 - 10 High risk rated sites
 - 16 Medium risk rated sites
 - 66 Low/No risk rated sites
 - Not expected to adversely affect the project
