

DEAR PROPERTY OWNER OR INTERESTED CITIZEN:

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Seven will hold a public hearing on Thursday, June 1, 2023, regarding the Project Development & Environment (PD&E) study, WPI Segment No.: 440749-1, for the proposed improvements to US 41/SR 45 at CSX Grade Separation from south of SR 676 (Causeway Boulevard) to north of Causeway Boulevard in Hillsborough County, a distance of approximately 1.3 miles. This project is a Design Change Reevaluation for the 1994 Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) for the construction of Causeway Boulevard as a six-lane roadway beginning at SR 60 and extending approximately 7 miles east to US 301.

This public hearing is being conducted in-person and online (virtually) to present information to and receive public input from interested persons regarding the proposed improvements.



Citizens who choose to attend the virtual hearing session may do so through a computer, tablet or smartphone via GoToWebinar. Virtual attendees must register online at the project website: http://active.fdotd7studies.com/us41/csx-to-sr676/. A call-in number will In-Person Location **not** be provided.

This public hearing will be conducted in accordance with all federal, state, and local requirements. This newsletter was also sent as notice to property owners (pursuant to Florida Statutes 339.155) that all or a portion of their property is within a minimum of 300 Time: 5:30 PM - 7:30 PM feet of the centerline of the alignment; however, this does not mean that all properties would be directly affected. The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried out by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) pursuant to 23 U.S.C. §327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated May 26, 2022 and executed by the Federal Highway Administration and FDOT.

What is a PD&E Study Reevaluation?

A reevaluation is the process used to document compliance with federal laws and to identify any changes that may have occurred since the approval of the original environmental document. The original PD&E study was approved on May 24, 1994. This reevaluation is needed to update the 1994 study, documenting changes in the project limits, design standards, reassessing socioeconomic and environmental impacts, and comparing any new alternative options with the previously approved roadway improvement.

Study Purpose

The purpose of this project is to reduce traffic delays associated with the CSX railroad crossing, support the safe movement of trucks/freight, and enhance safety and connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists. The PD&E study objectives include: determining proposed typical sections and developing preliminary conceptual design plans for proposed improvements while minimizing impacts on the environment; considering agency and public comments; and ensuring project compliance with all applicable federal and state laws. The No-Build alternative, where no improvements other than routine maintenance are made to the existing roadways, will remain viable throughout the remainder of this study.

Project Description

The proposed improvements will include various intersection improvements and multimodal facilities (pedestrian and bicycle accommodations). The concept proposes the grade separation of US 41 over the CSX Railroad while maintaining the existing mainline lane counts and adds frontage roads and ramps that provide east-west connectivity in the project corridor. The proposed improvements will require additional right-of-way detailed on the concept boards at the hearing and in the appendix of the Preliminary Engineering Report (PER).

Existing Conditions

Causeway Boulevard is a divided 4-lane urban roadway and US 41 is a divided six-lane urban roadway throughout the project limits. The posted speed limit on Causeway Boulevard is 45 mph throughout the project limits. The posted speed limit on US 41 varies from 50-55 miles per hour within the project limits. The existing ROW width along Causeway Boulevard ranges from 100-160 feet. The existing ROW width along US 41 ranges from 100-250 feet.

Preferred Alternative

The preferred alternative is composed of multiple roadway sections. Please see the insert to view the proposed typical sections.



Right-of-Way Acquisition Procedure

We understand that when a transportation project proposes the acquisition of private property, you may have questions and concerns. To better educate and inform you about the right-of-way acquisition process and your rights, the FDOT has created real estate acquisition and relocation brochures. 



US 41 (SR 45) from N. of Trenton Street to S. of St. Paul Street and N. of Causeway Blvd. (at grade)




